The August meeting of Horton Council was held in the Municipal Building on August 1 at 7:30 p.m.

The township of Ross asked Horton to enter a team in their annual horseshoe tournament at Foresters Falls on August 2 at 6:30 p.m. Morris Burton and Menzie Storie will represent the township.

Approval was received from the Department of Highways of By-Law No 677, being a supplementary road expenditure by-law in the amount of \$3,500.00.

A letter was received from the Renfrew Agricultural Society soliciting a grant from the township for the 1968 Fair. A motion was passed authorizing the usual grant of \$100.00 for 1968.

Tenders were opened for the purchase of Horton Community Hall, and the tender of Edward B. Mask of Bancroft was accepted; the tender price being \$2,100.00.

Mrs. Samuel Wilson Noted Social Worker Dies at Arnprior

ARNPRIOR, Jan. 14, ¹⁹⁵⁸ (Special)—Mrs. Samuel G. Wilson, widely known in the Ottawa Valley, died at her Elgin street home here following a lengthy illness.

Mrs. Wilson was among the most noted of social workers in the valley.

The former Edith Lillian Glenn, she was a daughter of the late Benjamin Glenn and Grace Yuill. She was born in Arnprior in 1894, and was educated here and at the Renfrew model school.

A school teacher, she held appointments at Beachburg, Stewartville and Rainy River for 10 years.

She attended Emmanuel Anglican Church.

Mrs. Wilson was secretary treasurer of Arnprior Women's Institute. She had been a past president of the society and was also a past president of the South Renfrew District Institute.

Mrs. Wilson also served three terms on the provincial board of the Women's Institute of Ontario, and was a member of the Women's Auxiliary of Emmanuel Church.

She married Samuel Wilson of Pembroke, in Arnprior, July 27, 1923.

Surviving, besides her husband, are two sons, Glenn Wilson of Pembroke, and Gilmour Wilson of Bassano, Alta., and six daughters, Mrs. F. Farrell (Grace), Lockerby, Mrs. R. Fitzpatrick (Jean), Kelowna, BC, Mrs. W. Howard (Margaret), Toronto, Mrs. J. Phillips (Mary), Bowmanville, Miss Louise Wilson, Ottawa, and Mrs. J. Lillie (Elizabeth), Ottawa.

Two brothers, Arthur Glenn of Ottawa, and Donald Glenn of Toronto, and a sister, Mrs. W. L. Sheffield of Hamilton, also survive.

The funeral was held from the Boyce funeral home here. Service was conducted in Emmanuel Church by Rev. R. G. Flander. Interment followed in Arnprior cemetery.
