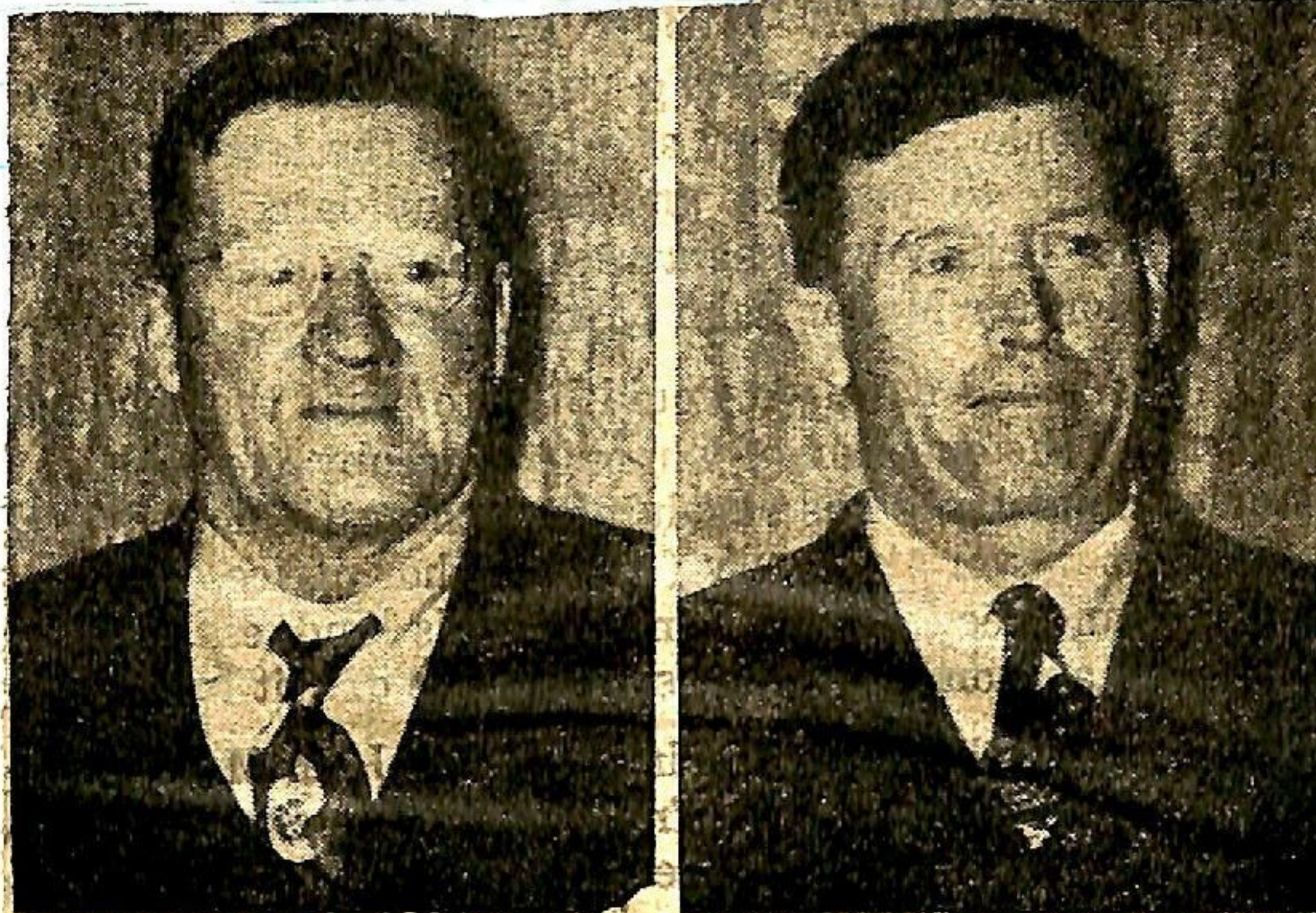

### Reeve Melville Eady Returned With 36 Vote Majority

Reeve Melville Eady was returned to office for his sixth term when he defeated Robert McGregor by a 36 vote majority in Monday's election in Horton Township.

Slightly over 65 percent of the eligible voters turned out on the dull, rainy day to cast their ballots. The support given Mr. Eady in his home riding swung the vote in his favor.

Horton Hall polled recorded 208 to 87 in favor of Mr. Eady, while Mr. McGregor polled a majority in Thomsonhill and Lochwinnoch. The recorded vote at these polls were 47 to 87 and 43 to 88, respectively.

The township council was elected by acclamation at nominations on Monday, Nov. 22. Elected were John Cole, Jr., Stewart McLaren, William Humphries and Leonard Lindsay.
