

But finally it was brought near home and set up on Mr. Jack Bentleys place on 6x7 near the highway and from there to Mr Jack Blands near the old Eastford School. Also was brought to Clute and set on Mr Goldings farm.

After the war, in 1947, it was moved north to mileage 126 $\frac{1}{2}$, also for Mr Cooper. At this time Mr Saul was tired of moving the mill so often and it remained on his own farm.

There was no one hurt in all the years of operating which I think was good management by Mr Saul.

To-day the mill is still licensed and still operates on Mr Sauls farm on 6x7.
