In Cochrane, Penner won nine of 13 polls and tied with Desjardins in two. Desjardins took three polls and the NDP were shut out. He won all four in Glackmeyer Township, and the one poll located in each of Fournier, Lamarche, and Hanna.

Penner managed to capture all polls in Terrace Bay and Hearst.

While opening a large bottle of wine in celebration, he thanked his workers both at the local level and in Ottawa. "We'll be back in 1988 after the country's flirtation with the Tories is over and they find out it has been a cold bath," he commented later. "It seems that every 20 years the Canadian people flirt with the

blue but always return to a Liberal government."

The two other northern Ontario Liberals returned are Maurice Foster of Algoma and Douglas Frith of Sudbury who served as Indian Affairs Minister under the short-lived Turner administration.

In Timiskaming, PC incumbent John MacDougall more than doubled the total votes for NDP candidate Jim Morrison, Liberal contender Lorraine Robazza, and Socred Ken Sweigard.

Timmins-Chapleau sent Aurèle Gervais, its first Tory ever, to Ottawa after the former Iroquois Falls mayor narrowly defeated Liberal Marcel Chartrand and NDP Cid Samson. Independent Peter Bruce polled a distant fourth.
