It was a free supper and the Cochrane Band came out for entertainment.

The first school fair was held ing 1927. W.I. gave their support with prizes and help from then on W.I helped whenever needed at the Booth and other places at fair time.

In 1928, the W.I. held a bazaar, and one of the highlights was 50 lbs of homemade candy made by Mrs. Thompson and Mrs. Stiles.

A Christmas concert was held at the school each year, and the Women's Institute prepared a Christmas treat for each pre-school and school children, also over 70. It used to be candy home made or bought, cookies, apples or oranges. Most times, we gathered at Mrs. R. Dodds home to fill the bags.

Our Clute History Book was first started in 1920 by Edith Stiles, she took it over in W.I. 1929-1939, it was then just a school scribbler type of book. In 1939, a hard cover book was designed by the Dodds family, Andy made the cover, Charlotte the art work, Mr. Dodds the metal work, Helen, Gordon and Mrs. Dodds put it together and so over the years our history has grown.

Oct. 7, 1933, our meeting was at Mrs. A. macDonald's, it was arranged to make a friendship circle quilt, each member making a block, later this had tickets sold. In June 1934, the North Cochrane District annual was held in Clute Church with 72 women attending.

The W.I. meeting was held at Mrs, Luptons home on her 79th Birthday 1942.

Mrs. Lupton demonstrated colouring hard boiled eggs with onion peel paper and cottons, these were then given to school children at Easter.

In 1936, Edith Stiles had a chart and contest at the meeting and each member gave height, weight and age. Mrs. E. Cowan who was 60, Edith Stiles who was 30, and Edith Phillips who was 15, each met the standards of the chart.
