

Committee donated a skating rink, a building and other lumber to the Branch for use as a Community Hall. The School Board gave permission to build the Hall on a piece of the School Ground. Parcels were made up for relief for the Belgian people who, due to the War, were in need of such. The Supt. of the Soldiers and Sailors Training School gave talks on the special courses in Domestic Science and Agriculture to be had from the Government. One interesting talk given by a Mr. Heaven's on "What to do with children during Vacation time," was with particular reference to boys.

The St. J. Hall was used as a Church after a fire destroyed the Union Church on First Ave, in 1919.

The Navy League and Red Cross were given donations to help in their work. The Hall was furnished with money earned from sales of lunches on "Demonstration Day" at the Government Farm, and Socials during the winter months. The members made layettes for Hospitals, helped with School Fairs, donating money for prizes, helping burned-out families in the Charlton Area fire of 1922. Sponsored dances during winter months, the money being used to help out the poorer families of the area, distributing good used clothing, food parcels, quilts and blankets to the needy.
