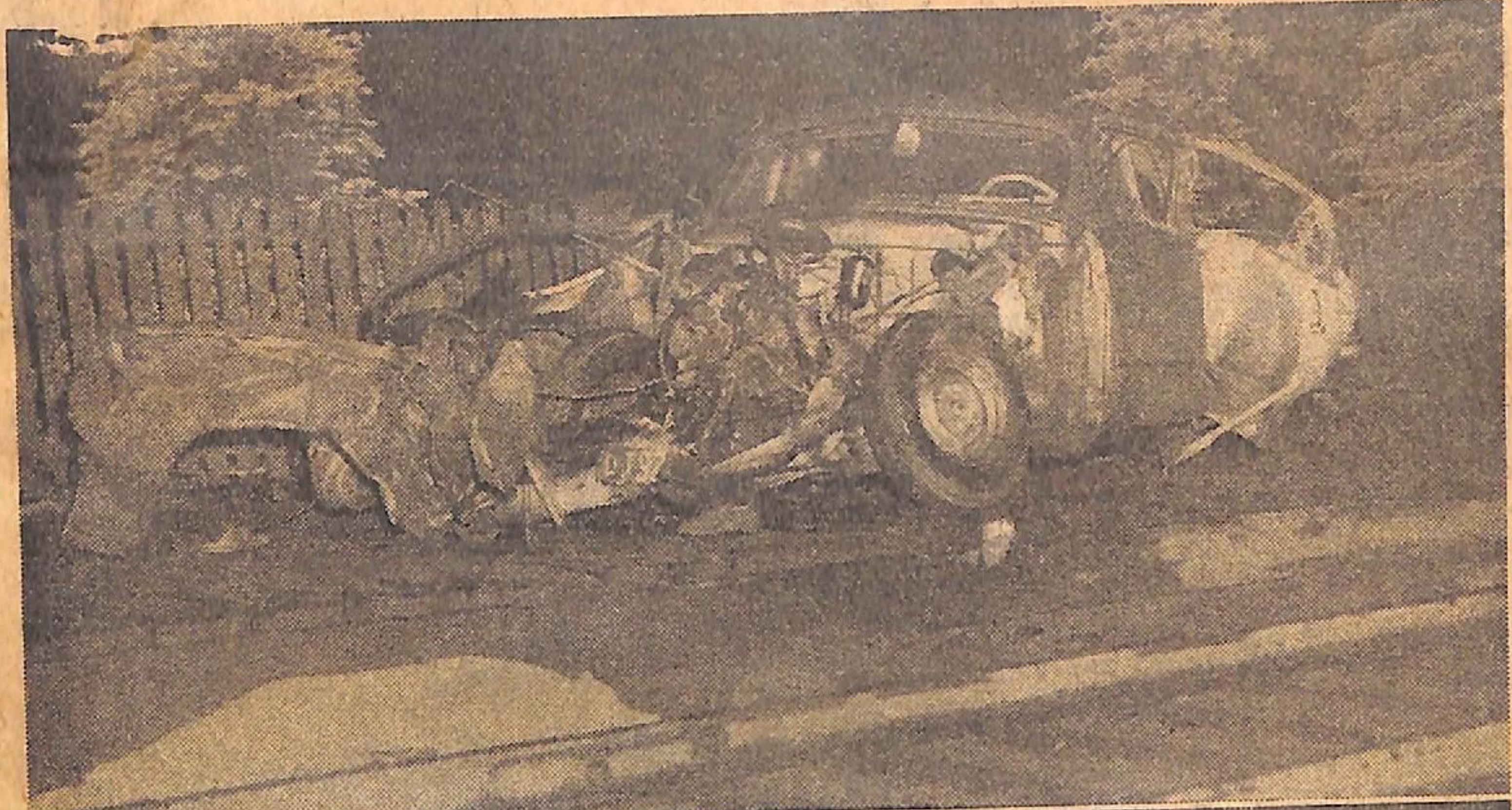


WHEN TRAIN AND AUTO MEET SATURDAY
JULY 18/1953

TWO BUSHMEN were killed instantly but a third escaped without a mark when a 47-car diesel-drawn freight train smashed into this car at an unprotected level crossing at Monteith Saturday. Dead are Rene Chasse, 25, of Mattan, Que., the driver of the car whose body lies under the wreckage where it was hurled by

the impact, 73 feet from the crossing, and a man named Savoie, 32, of Bathurst, N.B., a passenger. Police have been unable to determine Savoie's christian name. His body was carried 163 feet from the crossing by the diesel. Leonard Bouchard, 24, also of Mattan, escaped without injury when he
