MONTEITH (Special) — In an exhibition game between the Cochrane Commandos and the Monteith Recreation Club of the Intertown Softball League, Monteith edged Cochrane 7 to 6 in nine innings of play. Monteith got 7 runs on 11 hits and made 3 errors, while the Commandos had 6 runs on 14 hits and made 2 errors.

The win went to Jack Stevens while the loss went to Grant Ash. After eight complete innings the score was tied 6-6. Jack Stevens managed to retire the Cochrane team in the top of the ninth inning. In the bottom of the ninth Monteith's first batter, John Williams, was thrown out by Buchan, in trying to stretch a double into a triple. The next batter Jack Stevens was hit by a pitched ball and Dunc Oliver hit a triple to drive in the winning run.

Cochrane left eight men on bases and Monteith had ten stranded. Stevens in winning struck out three and walked two. Laflaur started for Cochrane, gave up one run on three hits and was relieved in the fourth by Ivan Ash. Ash gave up two runs on one hit, but walked three in two innings of play. His brother, Grant Ash, was then brought in the top of the fifth and promptly retired the side. Grant Ash in working four innings gave up three runs on seven hits.
