

Schools: - (Village known as Driftwood City
for first school)

Monteiths First School was built on the opposite side of the Driftwood River but (was held in home of ~~Robert~~ ^{first teacher, Mrs Jones}) was destroyed by fire. The next school built in 1913 was used until 1928, as the one roomed building had become too small to accomodate the pupils. The W. J. Hall and a room in the Northern Academy had been in use for a while before the second school was built (or rather 3rd) The next school built in 1929¹⁹²⁶ (2 roomed) also grew too small and a new modern building was built in 1961. (Now owned by Bill McGee)

During the years, pupils from several other small schools in the area, which had been closed were attending the Monteith Public School and this made it necessary to build a larger school. Many other buildings had been used during the crowded times, one was the St. Marys Anglican Church Rectory.

At the present time and the past 2 or 3 years pupils, grades 1 to 5 attend the Monteith School (Gr School) The grades, 6, 7 & 8 attend the Sr Public School in Shullington. Busses transport the Monteith pupils to Shullington and then the 1 to 5 grades are transported to the Monteith School.

Their curriculum is up-to-date and many activities and sports are enjoyed by the pupils which the limited space would not allow before.
