### MONTEITH INDUSTRIAL FARM

Almost 150 men, sentenced to short jail terms, now reside at the Monteith Industrial Farm. The farm is worked on the "honor system," in which the men are given every possible freedom. Armed guards do not patrol high grey walls around this prison nor are there heavy iron bars over all windows. To most men it is a temporary home — a true farm, where they do their work,

eat well and live comfortably. Regularly during the year, the prisoners hold sportsdays and receive entertainment programs. Jail breaks are few and far between. Only two men have left the farm so far this year. Monteith is in charge of Superintendent D. Whyte. — (Daily Press Photo).
