First high school classes held here in 1920-21
First principal - Mr Johnson. Later the above bldg used
as a girls dormitory, still later, ¹⁹⁴⁷ used as apartments for
Guards families. When Monteith Industrial Farm opened, ^{second} time
the dormitory for boys was, at that time in administration
Bldg. Built in 1920, Closed by Govt in 1935.

Fire of unknown origin
destroyed the former
home of Philip Critchley
a resident of Monteith
for many years, before
moving to Matheson.

Home was built after
the big fire of 1916 in North
Former owners (after
Critchley left) were Hesson's,
Morrisson's and D.W.
Stalker. Rented to
Marcel Trotter family at
time of fire.
