# Plans laid now for next school Fall Fair

Fall Fair - 1977 discussed

A meeting of the Monteith-Shillington Fall Fair Association was held in the gym of the Monteith Public School. Principals, Mrs. Janice Wells of Monteith Public School and Mr. Gord Phillips of Shillington Senior Public School presided over the meeting on November 9.

Election of officers was held. The fall fair will be held in Shillington Senior Public School in September of 1977. Mr. Gord Phillips was named president, Shillington vice-president is Ann Tritton; secretary-treasurer is Connie Clark.

The secretary-treasurer, Ann Krikken gave a financial statement for the past year. The next item was checking into each

section of the Fall Fair book, reading comments by the judges and, where it was necessary, making changes. When the book is reprinted the changes will be made.

A discussion took place on the amount of money the six plaques and the engraving cost. It was decided to go to a smaller trophy with less engraving, and not to give the firsts in senior and junior gardens \$5.00 cash as well as a trophy.

A discussion was held on gardens—whether to join seniors and juniors together and to only give three trophies. It was decided that first year gardeners would not be able to compete with older children so there will still be junior and seniors in the gardening. Fif-

teen students entered the home gardening this past year. The auction will be held as usual.

Another discussion was held on how to raise money for the Fall Fair as funds are low. The secretary-treasurer is to enquire. Each vice-president will hold a bake sale with proceeds going to the Fall Fair only, instead of to the school fund and the Fall Fair as has been done in the past.

The meeting discussed trying to get the kindergarten entries in.

There were 13 parents and friends in attendance at the meeting as well as teachers from Monteith, Mrs. Kathleen Murray and Mrs. Janice Wells, and from Shillington, Principal Mr. Gord Phillips.
