Peters named superintendent

Walter E. Peters is the new Monteith Correctional Institute superintendent. His appointment became effective Tuesday, September 2.

Peters moved to Monteith from the Ontario Correctional Institute in Brampton where he served as deputy superintendent since October 1, 1974 and, more recently, acting superintendent. He replaces Norman Bamford who retired June 30.

Originally from Galt, Ontario (now part of Cambridge), Peters received a Bachelor of Arts degree from the University of Western Ontario in 1963 and a Bachelor of Theology degree in 1966. He gained experience as a social worker with the Sarnia Children's Aid Society from

1966 to 1969 and was appointed assistant superintendent of Brookside School for juvenile boys in 1969. He was later promoted to the position of deputy superintendent at Brookside.

In 1974 Peters was appointed deputy superintendent at Burwash Correctional Centre, where he co-ordinated the programs of Camp Bison, a satellite facility. When Burwash closed, he was appointed deputy superintendent at Brampton.

"I am very excited about coming to Monteith," Peters says, adding that his wife is anxious to move up to the north.

Mr. and Mrs. Peters have no children, but have a cat and an English bulldog.
