Former 1977 pastor dies

A former well-known pastor of St. Mark's Anglican Church in Iroquois Falls and an early resident of Monteith, Rev. Neil Lothian died in Port Colborne this summer. Word of his passing has been received by Rev. Michael Rolph, the present pastor of the church.

Rev. Rolph has announced that a special memorial service for Rev. Lothian will be held at St. Mark's Church on Sunday, September 18 at 3 p.m.

At the time of his death, Rev. Lothian was honorary assistant to the Rev. Canon William Straw of St. James Church in Port Colborne. He suffered a stroke early in the year and after showing initial signs of recovery, he had a number of set-backs which caused his health to decline steadily.

The late Rev. Lothian was a former chairman of the Cochrane-Iroquois Falls Board of Education.

According to Rev. Rolph, Mrs. Lothian travelled north after the funeral to stay with her sister near Elk Lake for a period of time. Her future plans are now known at this time.

"The memorial service has been organized to provide people of Iroquois Falls and the rest of the Diocese of Moosonee with an opportunity to mark the passing of this faithful pastor, priest and friend," said Rev. Rolph.
