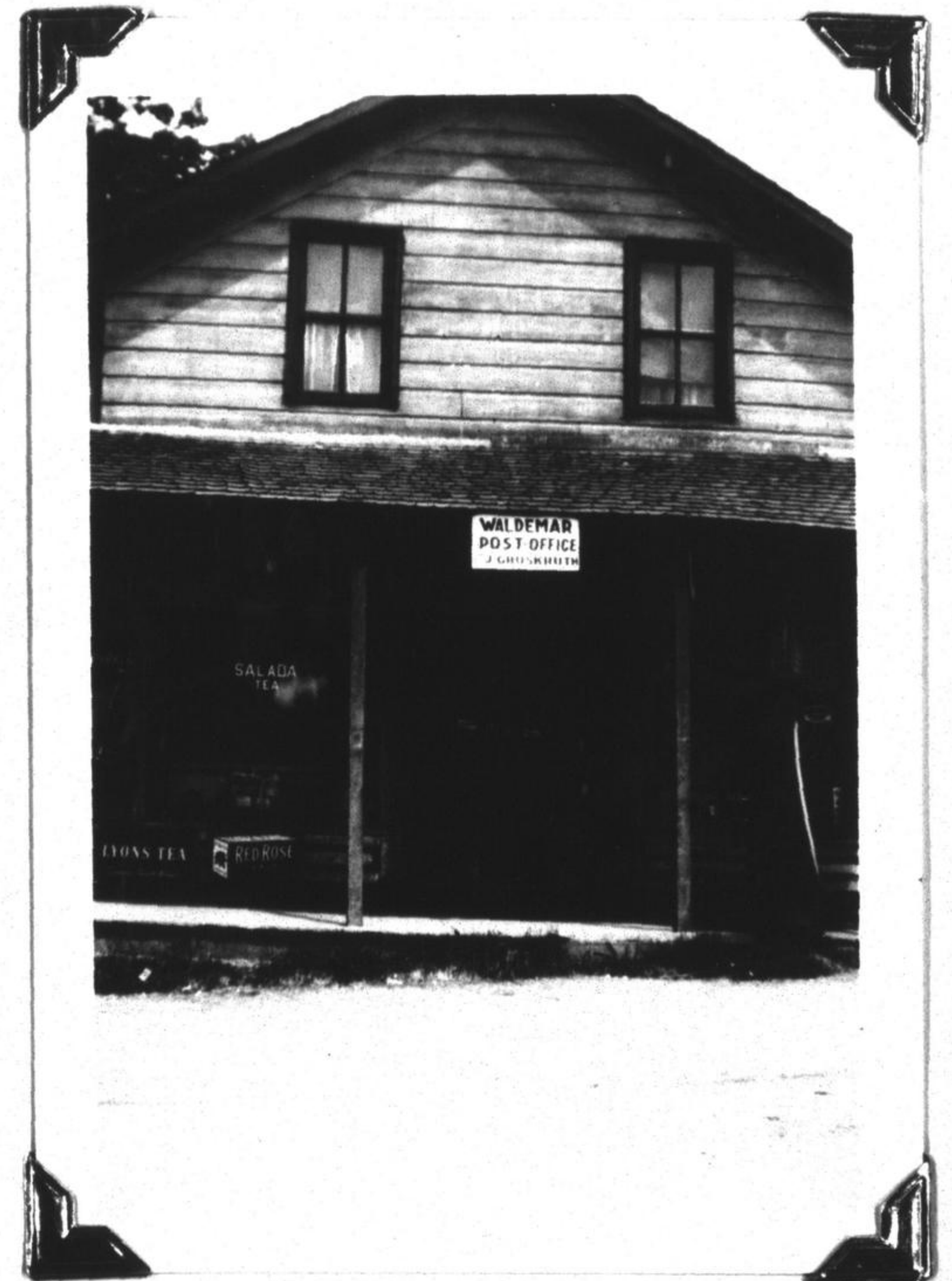


WALDEMAR POST OFFICE

As far as known, Waldemar Post Office was opened January 1st, 1870 with David Jenkins as post master. He also carried the mail across the fields to Grand Valley. They lived and had the post office in the house on the street back up from Main Street, across from MacFadgean's farm. Frank Tate's lived in it for awhile and then sold it to Mr. and Mrs. Sydney Melen who finally used it for a chicken house. It was later torn down. Later there was a trailer owned by Mr. Dunnett situated on this property. He used this during the summer months.

Following this, John Johnston, Ed Greskurth, then John Greskurth, Miss McColeman who lived where R. Rodgers lived were post masters. In 1930, D.E. Watson built the other store, In 1931 John Greskurth got the Post Office back. He kept the store and was Post Master until 1951, when John Avison bought it. Russell Little bought it in 1952. Followed by Clarence Vance, Mr. and Mrs. Fraser, the McCallans, Bob Mill and Harold Bible.

The Post Office was closed May 31st, 1969 and moved to Grand Valley. The store now has been closed and used as a residence.
