#### BEAVER RELEASED BY HALTON SPORTSMEN'S ASSOC.

At a recent meeting of the Halton Conservation Committee, Mr. Geo. E. Elliott, president of the Halton County Sportsmen's Association announced that four beavers had been released in Nassageweys Township. Notwithstanding the fact that these animals were not released until September, they erected a dam three feet in height, built their winter home and an area several acres in extent has been flooded. At the same meeting it was also announced that with the cooperation of Halton County Council a pond site has been established on the escarpment near Nelson with the aid of mechanical equipment. This necessitated the erection of an earthen dam some 400 feet long and ten feet in height.

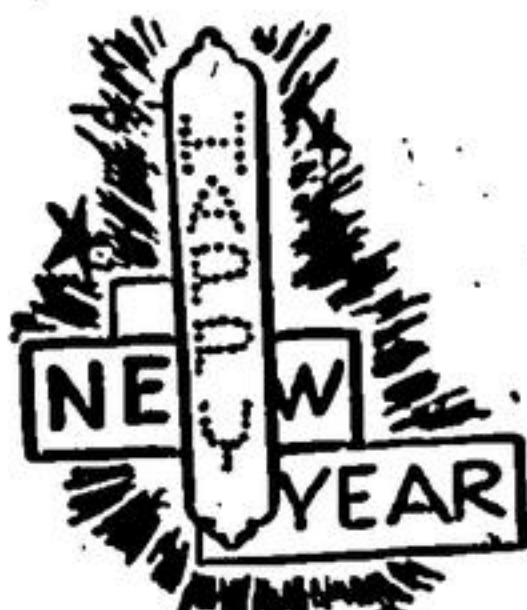
