Delaney, 13, will dance the role of Dragonfly during the Thursday, Dec. 2 show.

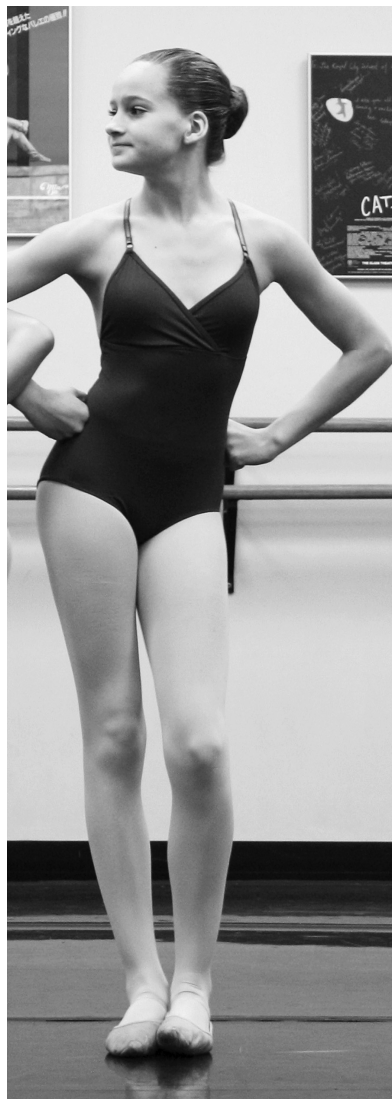

Ballet Jörgen Canada is Ontario's second largest dance company with 16 full-time dancers, and brings ballets to about 50 communities annually.
