NOTICE OF PUBLIC INFORMATION CENTRE #2

Trafalgar Road Short-Term Intersection and Operations Review Trafalgar Road (Regional Road 3) from Steeles Avenue (Regional Road 8) to Highway 7 Town of Halton Hills

Study

Halton Region is completing a Short-Term Intersection and Operations Review to address existing and short-term (1-5 year) operational needs along the Trafalgar Road (Regional Road 3) corridor from Steeles Avenue (Regional Road 8) to Highway 7. As part of this study, a number of road improvement alternatives have been examined, including; auxiliary lanes (left and right turn lanes), traffic signal upgrades and timing adjustments, pavement rehabilitation as well as improvements to signage and pavement markings.

Background

In March 2009, Halton Region issued a "Notice of Study Cancellation" for the Trafalgar Road Class Environmental Assessment (EA) Study. The purpose of the Study was to address long-term transportation planning needs in the Trafalgar Road corridor from No. 10 Sideroad to Highway 7. The Study was cancelled because of the potential impact that several other planning studies would have on the Trafalgar Road corridor needs. These studies include: Halton Transportation Master Plan Update to 2031, Halton/Peel Boundary Area Transportation Study and GTA West Corridor Study. Long-term planning solutions will be examined following completion of these studies. To address current operational concerns along Trafalgar Road, a Short-Term Intersection and Operations Review along the Trafalgar Road corridor from Steeles Avenue to Highway 7 is being undertaken by the Region.

Public Information Centres

Following the first Public Information Centre (PIC #1), held on June 22, 2010, a preferred solution has been developed taking into consideration problems identified, alternative solutions, environmental impacts, and comments received from the Town of Halton Hills and the public. The preferred solution includes a combination of recommendations designed to:

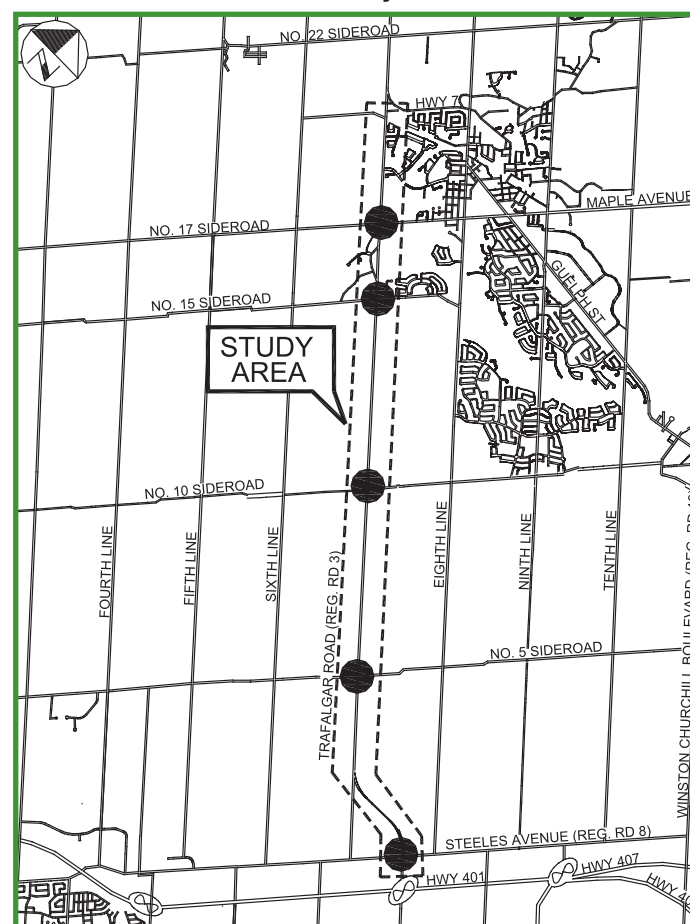
- Improve traffic operations (e.g. new turn lanes and localized widening at No. 5 Sideroad and No. 10 Sideroad);
- Improve safety (e.g. improved signage and pavement markings); and
- Reduce speeding through the implementation of a Speed Management Strategy.

A second PIC has been scheduled for the public to review the preferred solution and provide comments to the study team. Following the information centre, the preferred solution will be reviewed taking into consideration the comments received from the public and confirmed or modified as required.
