Teens hoping to taste success with BBQ sauce

Two Georgetown teens are making a big splash with their own brand of barbecue sauce that they intend to take nationwide.

Sixteen-year-olds Jordan Liantzakakis and Drew Gilchrist, Grade 11 students at Georgetown District High School, have come up with what they feel is a unique product that complements a wide variety of grilled meats.

Over 100 bottles of Fuse The Flavour were sold in one day by the two GDHS Rebels' wrestling team members when they first set up shop at the Downtown Georgetown Farmers' Market in the spring, and while sales have leveled off recently, it's become a business venture the pair hopes will end up in the big-chain grocery stores.

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Ontario voters will have 29 days to cast a ballot this fall

Elections Ontario is taking aim at declining voter turnout by providing Ontario residents with 29 days to vote in the Oct. 6 provincial election.

That number of days is far greater than ever before and the introduction

of special ballots will allow people to vote in person or by mail.

The 2007 provincial election, in which the Liberals formed a second consecutive majority government, hit an all-time low for voter turnout with

52.8 per cent of eligible voters casting their ballot, outstripping the 1923 record low of 54.7 per cent

Besides being able to cast their ballots at the 10 advance polls or on election day, Ontarians will be able to vote

by mail or in person a month in advance. Starting on Sept. 7, people can apply to Elections Ontario for special ballots. Applications can be submitted up until six days before Oct. 6.

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
