

Audience to experience three plays in random order

The Acton District High School Drama Department is pushing the limits for their annual spring play once again. Under the direction of teacher Jennifer Ross, students demonstrated

a teaser of "Red3" to select community members on Wednesday, April 18.

"Red3" comprises of three separate plays, each roughly thirty minutes, inspired by Little Red Riding Hood and dealing with identity and relationships.

One is a Soap Opera based comedy, another a mystical retelling of Red Riding Hood, and the last is a modern story involving identity theft. All plays were co-written by students.

"It's pretty unique," said Ross. "The audience will

travel from play to play. The order you see the plays in will determine the experience you have. Each play will be performed three times a night."

Ross has been doing productions at Acton High for 15 years. The only big production she didn't direct was "The Lion, The Witch and The Wardrobe" in 2012. Over that time, they have tried a number of ideas to keep the plays fresh. Last year, Acton did an interactive version of "Romeo and Juliet" with a 1940's bootlegging twist. "Peter Pan" was done with five stages surrounding an audience on swivel chairs.

"Fuente Ovejuna" took the audience through the town and determined the murderer by audience vote at intermission.

"There isn't a template we could refer to for this kind of production," continued Ross. "There are a lot of working parts. Timing the three productions

will be tricky. We've had to construct three stages, one for each of the former locker bays."

But, for Ross, challenge is part of the experience. "I like that Acton's productions are unusual. This production is very experimental and I really hope it works—it will be a lot of fun finding out."

Show dates are May 2, 3 and 4.

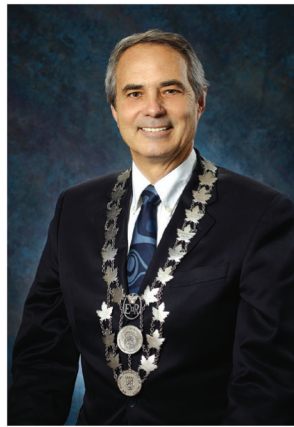

To make the recycling of household hazardous waste and electronic waste more convenient for Halton residents, Halton Region holds Special Waste Drop-off Days throughout the year.

Halton residents may drop off the following household hazardous waste or electronic materials, free of charge:

Household hazardous waste



Acceptable materials

- Acids, solvents and glues
- Aerosol cans (full or partially full)
- Automotive liquids (antifreeze, fuel, motor oil and filters)
- Batteries (household and car)
- Fluorescent lights (compact bulb and tubes)
- Household cleaners, bleach and pool chemicals
- Mercury containing devices
- Paints, stains and varsol (full or partially full)
- Personal care products and medications
- Pesticides, garden chemicals and fertilizers
- Pressurized cylinders (less than 20 lbs)
- Sharps (must be in a sealed container)
- Waste vegetable cooking oil

Electronic waste



This is an OES-approved event. Clear all personal information from computers, cell phones and electronics prior to drop off. Ensure all memory storage areas have been cleared of private information.

Acceptable materials

- Cameras
- Cell phones
- Computers and computer accessories (e.g. batteries, monitors, etc.)
- DVD players
- Phones
- Printers
- Stereos
- TVs
- VCRs

Unacceptable materials

- Appliances
- Asbestos
- Biomedical waste
- Commercial and industrial waste
- Explosives and ammunition
- PCBs
- Radioactive waste
- Reuse materials (e.g. clothing, antiques, etc.)
- Scrap metal
- Tires
- Vacuums
