

Paul Murr Golf Tournament raises \$48,000

The 34th annual Paul Murr Memorial Golf Tournament took place on Monday at Blue Springs Golf Course and was another great success. 130

golfers and sponsors raised \$48,000 to fight cancer. "This brings our 34-year total donations to the Acton branch of the Canadian Cancer Society to over \$1.2 million," said Allan Hall, one of the

tournament organizers.

Paul Murr was a native Acton son, who in his younger years had been a track athlete specializing in middle distances. He was a well-known business man and avid golfer.

He died in 1988 from cancer but not before learning that the tournament was to be named in his honour. The tournament has been held at the challenging Blue Springs course since it opened in 1991.
