Habitat for Humanity Home ready for new occupants

Habitat for Humanity Halton-Mississauga, along with their partners, Community Living Halton North, held a dedication ceremony and open house on Friday to celebrate completion of their project at 92 Mill Street West.

More importantly, the house is ready to accommodate the three autistic men that will be living there. Nelson, Deon and Craig were presented with key/plaques at a reception at the Legion.

The Bett-Knowlton Build Project was named after two long-standing Habitat volunteers, Chris Bett and Austin Knowlton, who

were at the event. The build was also part of a broader program, the Jimmy and Rosalynn Carter Work Project, which built 150 new affordable homes across Canada to celebrate the country's 150th birthday.

The home is an entirely accessible, state of the art building that went up quickly last summer with the generous support of local and regional donors like Sobeys and Whirlpool, and others too numerous to mention. Local businesses contributed financially and also provided teams of employees to help with construction.

The project was delayed because the driveway couldn't be completed in the

winter. But the final touches have been made to the trim and interior, and the men are said Bonnette.
