## Halton Hills Library offers 'provocative' lecture series

The Town of Halton Hills and the Halton Hills Public Library has announced a new lecture series set to kick off next month featuring faculty from the University of Guelph.

In a release sent Monday, Nov. 27, the library said it will use funding received from the Ontario Seniors Community Grant program to support what it is calling a "provocative" lecture series.

"The Halton Hills Lecture Series is an exciting collaborative event between the library, the Town of Halton Hills, and the University of Guelph," said chief librarian Geoff Cannon in the release. "This generous grant, provided by the Ministry of Seniors Affairs, will allow the library to feature fascinating talks from across a vari-
