COMMON QUESTIONS ABOUT TINNITUS - PART 1 WHAT IS IT?

Tinnitus is a subjective experience where one hears a sound, ringing or noise when no external physical sound is present. Some call it "head noises", "ear ringing," or other similar things.

WHAT CAUSES IT?

There are many causes; indeed almost everything that can go wrong with the ear has Tinnitus associated with it as a symptom. Things as simple as wax against the eardrum to very serious items such as tumors on the 7th facial nerve can produce Tinnitus. Meniere's disease has Tinnitus associated with it. One of the most common causes of Tinnitus is exposure to excessively loud sounds such as shooting, chain saws, rock concerts, or other loud noises.

Three Halton Hills residents facing impaired driving charges

Halton Police have identified three Halton Hills residents charged with impaired driving in the past week.

On Sunday, Nov. 26, after 2:30 a.m., a traffic stop was initiated near Mountainview Road North and John Street in the town of Halton Hills. As a result of an investigation, James Boose, 21, of Halton Hills was charged with driving over 80 milligrams.

On Tuesday, Nov. 29, after 11 a.m., a traffic stop was initiated near Longfield Road. As a result of an investigation, Michael Brock, 61, of Halton Hills was charged with impaired over 80 milligrams.

On Friday, Dec. 1, after 2:30 a.m., a traffic stop was initiated near Guelph Street and Adamson Street. As a result of an investigation, Robert Wight, 20, of Halton Hills was charged with impaired operation of a motor vehicle and driving over 80 milligrams.

None of the allegations have been proven in a court of law.
