Police launch Project Safe Start Monday

With children heading back to class next week Halton Regional Police will kick off Project Safe Start to increase safety near schools.

This marks the eighth year of the campaign that focuses on education, awareness and high-visibility enforcement of traffic laws in and around school zones.

The campaign is run in conjunction with the first two weeks that Halton school children return to class. This year's campaign will run Sept. 2-13.

Officers will use a multi-faceted approach to remind motorists to be on alert for increased pedestrian and vehicle traf-

fic in school zones and to pay attention to crossing guards. Police will be cracking down on speeders, aggressive drivers, and those who use hand-held devices while driving. Seatbelt compliance will be strictly enforced.

Frontline officers from various areas of the service will participate in the project and on Tuesday, Sept. 10 senior officers, divisional commanders and police executive officers will take part in the All Hands on Deck component of the project.

Halton residents have ranked traffic as their number one policing priority in previous surveys.
