Raiders' netminding duties rest with a pair of Michaels

The Georgetown Jr. A Raiders opened training camp at the Alcott Arena on Monday with several returnees from last year's squad and two new goalies in the fold.

Actually, one of the signed netminders is making a return to the Raiders after seasons with Oakville and a team in B.C.

Nineteen-year-old goalie Michael Stiliadis of Woodbridge was picked up by Georgetown coach and general manager Greg Walters in a trade for veteran defenceman Alex Adams with Victoria of the BCHL after posting an 11-0-1 record as a backup for the Raiders in 2010-11.

Goaltending was a sore spot for the Raiders in last season's elimination at the hands of the eventual Ontario Junior Hockey League-champion St. Michael's Buzzers and Walters feels the team now has stability between the pipes with Stiliadis and 17-year-old Michael Singh of Stoney Creek, who is committed to Harvard University for the 2015-16 season.

"Michael is a proven number-one Jr. A goalie who had a pretty good season out west last year," said Walters of Stiliadis's 15-8-6 record in 31 starts with Victoria, posting a 2.96 goals-against average.

"And we've got a good young goalie behind him with the other Michael, six-foot-three and very committed."

The Raiders have three returning blueliners in Tyler MacPherson, Phil Kiss and local resident Liam Clare, while 19-year-old defender Gavin Shantz was acquired from the Burlington Cougars. Another rearguard with OHL experience was expected to be in camp this week.

Brendan Jacome and John Adams are among the returnees and Walters dealt for another BCHLer, Liam Board, a Burlington native who played for Oakville in 2011-12.

Also signed is 16-year-old centre Andrew Court, captain of last season's Burlington midget AAA Eagles.

The OJHL's regular-season scheduling format for this season has changed to allow for each team in the league to play each other at least once home and away. The Raiders begin their campaign Friday, Sept. 6 in Lindsay against the Muskies and will welcome their old rivals, the Oakville Blades, for the home opener on Saturday, Sept. 7.

"It's going to mean some extra travel for us, but I think our fans will be excited to see some new teams, new blood," added Walters, who is back for a fourth season in Georgetown.

The Raiders have just two exhibition games scheduled, in Georgetown on Friday, Aug. 30 at 7:30 p.m. and then the IceHawks play host to Georgetown Saturday, Aug. 31 at 7:30 p.m.
