The *Antiques Road Show* is a very popular PBS television show in which participants bring their treasures and heirlooms to be viewed by all and informally appraised by experts.

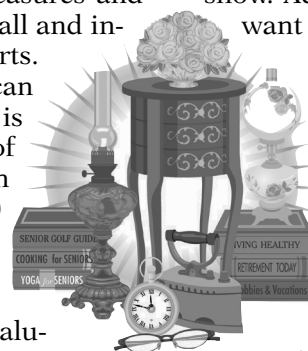

The event is a memorial run for club member Glen Collins who died last year and stayed at the hospice, located in Inglewood.

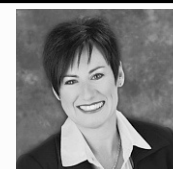
Registration for the run is from 10 to 11 a.m. at St. George Pub and Res-
