The fall workshops are aimed at the actor's craft, i.e. voice, characterization, improv, along with directing, and stage management. The spring workshops are free and are about building the spring production, i.e. costume design and construction, set building, painting, and lighting. 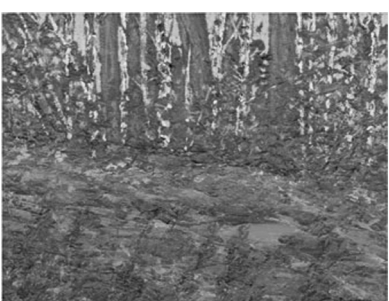
phone the Studio and sign up for a specific time.


