Nurse claims two rowing medals

Cristy Nurse of Georgetown earned a pair of medals at the World Rowing Championships in South Korea over the weekend in the women's fours and eights events.

Nurse, 26, joined teammates Sarah Black of Ottawa, Victoria, B.C.'s Christine Roper and Thorold's Natalie Mastracci in the Canadian boat that finished runner-up to the U.S. in a time of six minutes 47.62 seconds, about three-and-a-half seconds behind the winners.

Those four Canuck rowers were also members of the women's eights team in red and white that placed third in Sunday's final, with the U.S. again exercising their dominance in that event with gold medals, crossing the finish line of the 2-km race in a time of 6:02.14. Romania was second in 6:07.04 and 2012 Olympics silver medalist Canada third in 6:09.74.

"It's the first time I've doubled up at the worlds, so to be on the podium twice is pretty special," said Nurse, who graduated from the University of Ottawa's law school in the spring.

"For me, it was nice to have that extra event to keep us sharp and once you're on the podium you want to be back there."
