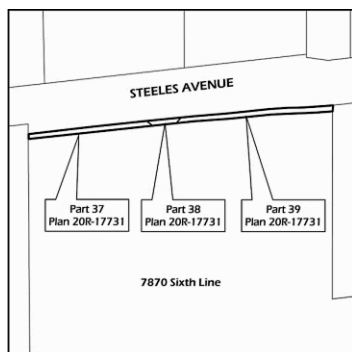

- Payments may be left at the Halton Hills Hydro Office (no receipts issued)

HOW?

- By CHEQUE or CASH

- To qualify for the Senior's Tax Grant applicants must be 65 years of age, own and occupy property in the Town of Halton Hills for one year and be in receipt of the Guaranteed Income Supplement. Police find 'large haul' of pot plants in cornfield

Line between Five & 10 Sideroads, where eight separate small patches, with about a dozen marijuana plants in each, were planted in a cornfield, almost ready to be harvested.

In total, approximately 1,000 plants were cut down and taken away for incineration at sites in Halton Hills, Milton and Burlington. None were discovered in Oakville.

With each plant producing about six ounces of the narcotic, valued at about \$200 an ounce on the street, Tanner estimated that between \$800,000 to \$1.2 million worth of marijuana was taken out of circulation.

"It's a fairly large and significant haul for this type of project," said Tanner.

"It certainly doesn't all take place today and our drug units are working on these things in Halton and around the province at this time of year. It's quite common in a lot of the rural areas. Sometimes it's difficult to determine exactly who has planted them and who's cultivating. Sometimes we do (know) and sometimes we can't, but that's the sort of size for this project today."

Det. Paul Foley said that he expects officers to be busy with

similar eradication efforts over the next one to three weeks in what's considered prime time for harvesting marijuana crops.

Officers wouldn't say how the crops at the Halton Hills location were discovered, but Foley noted that seizures typically come from calls from landowners who come across the plants or by thermal imaging from low-flying patrol airplanes or helicopters.
