Sudbury-born songwriter and artist Jake Mathews now calls Alberta home, and he has himself garnered several CCMA awards nominations, including a Rising Star nomination. With a new CD out, his fourth, and a new song ("Beer Necessities) gaining attention on radio. Mathews is a veteran songwriter who is no stranger to the Alberta and Nashville music

Easterling is a hit songwriter in the Nashville scene (among his many cuts, he wrote "Modern Day Drifter", the title track for Dierks Bentley multi-platinum CD) who has a long history as a songwriter and producer (as well as record label executive), and he has just completed a new CD, early copies of which will be available at the performance.
