
Local gardeners win TERRA awards

Three Georgetown gardeners captured TERRA Purple Pepper Awards for their gardening efforts at the firm's inaugural awards ceremony held at the TERRA greenhouses in Waterdown.

Almost 200 people entered the five categories- Best Edible Garden, Best Edible Garden by a Child or Children, Best Edible Container Garden, Best Edible Balcony Garden, and Best Edible Exotic Garden. The application process was open to all Ontario residents during June and July.

The top three gardens were selected in each category, based on photos submitted, and then TERRA's group of judges set out to look at the 15 gardens.

Georgetown winners were Sandra Blakley who placed second in the Best Edible Container Garden category, Naomi Coffey , who was third in the Best Edible Garden by a Child or Children class, and Karen Mattan who was second in the Best Edible Garde n division.
