
• North Halton Red Cross reports more than \$100,000 had been donated to its office by community members— with schoolchildren leading the way— which had been raised for victims of the tsunami disaster in southeast Asia.

• Town reverses decision to add 4,700 acres to Greenbelt.

• Halton Hills elementary school students have the best teeth in the area, according to a survey presented to the Halton Region's health & social services committee. Local children had the lowest mean number of teeth affected by decay— 1.63 per cent, compared to fourth-place Milton's 2.43 per cent.

• The Georgetown Raiders defeat St. Michael's Buzzers 3-1 in the final game of the Dudley Hewitt Cup at the Alcott Arena to earn a spot in the Royal Bank Cup Jr. A championship tournament in Weyburn, Sask. The Raiders were eliminated from the RBC Cup semifinals with an 8-2 loss to the Camrose Kodiaks.

• There were no injuries when a group of Veterans from Halton Hills was in a bus that slid off a road called Canadian Lane in Belgium during their return to the Netherlands and western Europe for Liberation Day celebrations.

• Georgetown District High School's TMI Jazz Band won the 33rd-annual Musicfest Canada in Richmond, B.C. for the second year in a row., an event that drew more than 10,000 musicians from across Canada and beyond.
