- The Town's budget committee decides to defer property funding for a community college due to uncertainty surrounding the proposed school, saving the municipality \$3.5 million.

- The reconstruction of Main St. in Georgetown in preparation for the summer's Homecoming festivities was estimated to be nearly \$500,000 more than the initial cost.

- A 21-year-old man was treated for five stitches to his neck at Georgetown Hospital after he was stabbed following a dispute at the toboggan hill at Cedarvale Park.

- Former Halton Region CAO Brent Marshall takes over as the new Town of Halton Hills Fire Chief, replacing Bob Meads, who resigned the position to take a public sector job.

- The North Halton midget BB Twisters won all six of their games to capture top spot at the International Silver Stick Minor Hockey Tournament in Sarnia to become the first team in the organization's 10-year history to achieve that feat.

- A man and woman were struck and killed by a car while rushing to the aid of accident victims in an overturned van on Trafalgar Rd. during whiteout conditions.

- The first six inductees are announced for the Halton Hills Sports Museum's inaugural Hall of Fame ceremony to take place in June— Bruce Andrews, Jim Ford, Bob Howard, Mary Ann Hayward, John McCauley and Hal Pells.

- Halton Hills Council agrees to remove longstanding allocations from six properties in Georgetown and Acton to allow for future ready-to-go development in response to a Region report outlining the inability of industries and businesses to move into the area.

- The Town of Halton Hills sets up a task force of councilors and citizens to develop a town-wide green plan.

- A man wearing a Mac's Milk uniform when Halton Police arrived on the scene turned out to be one of two suspects in the robbery of the Delrex Blvd. convenience store earlier in the day. The Brampton men were later charged after the two female employees of the store— who were found locked in a freezer— opened a door from the inside and alerted the officers, "That's the robber!"
