Hard work pays off for MacNeil, Richards "We won the trials in Canada six

Georgetown's Jake MacNeil and his partner, Andrew Richards of London, sealed their spot in the beach volleyball competition for the 2014 Youth Olympic Games in China with a thrilling 2-1 victory over a U.S. team over the weekend in Puerto Rico.

Representing Canada, MacNeil and Richards, who went undefeated in their three outings during the preliminary phase of the NORCECA Central Zone Boys' Qualification Tournament on Saturday, arrived into the decisive contest after another three-set battle with Mexico's Luis Ramos and Jesus Rodriguez 2-1 (21-14, 23-25, 15-13) in the semifinals.

"I am thrilled and speechless after this great moment," an emotional MacNeil said afterward.

'We won the trials in Canada six months ago to come to this tournament and we have been training very hard since then. The work hard has paid off."

Just a couple of weeks after his Georgetown District High School senior boys' indoor volleyball team lost in the gold medal match at the Ontario quad-A championships in Mississauga, MacNeil said after that loss that winning the event in Puerto Rico would be the highlight of what's already been an impressive career.

"I never thought this thing was going to be possible," added Richards.

"It is like a dream representing our country in the Nanjing Games and I want to give credit to my partner, my coaches and my parents."

The 2014 Youth Olympic Games will take place in Nanjing, China, Aug. 16-

Chargers win Halton Tier I title

Georgetown's Centennial Chargers defeated previously unbeaten CH Norton of Burlington in two straight sets (25-17, 25-19) to win the Halton District School Board's Tier I boys' elementary volleyball championship in Milton last week.

The Chargers, who had dropped just one set in four matches Thursday leading up to that evening's final at Milton District High School, were able to neutralize Norton's towering up-front trio, who had swept the Stewarttown Stingers out of the preliminary round earlier on.

It was Centennial's fifth Halton Tier I boys' title since 2003.
