The first weekend of winter was a nasty one of ice, wind and cold. Many residents lost power but kept informed through social media.

Here are a selection of tweets issued from local politicians, Halton Police, residents and Halton Hills Hydro.

Sunday morning

Halton Regional Police Service: "All our calls right now are for 'unsafe conditions', tweeted the Halton Hills-Milton detachment of Halton Regional Police.

Halton Hills Hydro: "Crews working to restore, but heavy ice build-up on trees and lines."

Halton Hills Mayor Rick Bonnette: "Halton Hills Hydro is doing everything to restore power but the weather is not co-operating. Too many trees are broken."

Councillor Jane Fogal: "Power still off and no wonder. Dawn shows devastation of trees. And the eerie sound of huge icy limbs crashing continues every few minutes."

Halton Hills Hydro: 10:30 a.m. Sunday "The ice storm has caused major damage throughout our territory. Crews are working around the clock to clear trees."

Mayor Rick Bonnette: Sunday 11 am #HaltonHills facilities are closed today. That is arenas, pools etc. Please pass this on. Thank you.

Sunday afternoon

Mayor Rick Bonnette: Sunday at 12:20 pm: Please stay off roads unless it is emergency. Not safe to walk as many branches r falling like toothpicks.

Mayor Rick Bonnette: 2:15 p.m. Huge THANK YOU to St. Alban's church Acton bringing food to hydro crews and to various homes in town.

Mayor Rick Bonnette: Halton Hills firefighters working with town's

public works using chain saws. Everyone pulling together as best we can.

Mayor Rick Bonnette: Speaking to Halton Hills hydro crews. Very frustrating for them. They get one area cleared then another branch or tree crashes down.

Mary Lou Egerton Foreman: Another neighbour's tree just fell in our backyard!

Moya Johnson: Tree almost down on the house. So sad! This tree about to fall on our house. Trees falling every minute. Yikes!xz

Sunday night

Halton Hills Hydro: New problems continue to be reported, every time our crews get close to restoring power, more branches and trees come down. It has been a slow process with all the ice.

Halton Hills Hydro: Thank you to everyone who has provided us with updates and a show of thanks. It is evident the Christmas spirit is in the air. Crews are working as quickly as possible to restore power.

Monday morning

Karen Adcock: Power finally back on at 6 a.m. this morning. Don't know if the store has power. Even the cats found it cold in here last night. Thank God for Tim Hortons.

Halton Hills Hydro: 9:30 a.m. Most of Acton has been restored with the exception of a couple of small areas. The very top end and south end of Churchill Road are still without power due to downed lines and tree. Thank you for your continued patience and support.
