The Halton Waste Management Site (HWMS) provides Halton residents with a convenient "one stop" location for reuse, recycling and proper waste disposal.

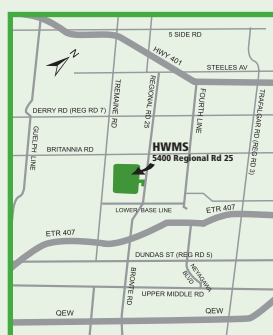
Please secure all open loads with a tarp or rope. If required, customers should bring someone to help unload heavy material. Attendants are not permitted to assist customers with the unloading of materials.

All customers and visitors are to report to the Scalehouse upon arrival.

Fees

For general waste and use of the Container Station, the user fees are:

- up to 50 kg – \$5/load
- 51 kg -150 kg – \$10/load
- over 150 kg – 15.2 cents/kg starting from 0 kg **NEW!**

Container Station

In addition to garbage disposal, the following materials can be dropped off and diverted from landfill (fees apply to the following items):



Appliances
(\$5 per appliance)



Drywall

Wood



Scrap metal



Yard waste

Additional items can be dropped off at the Halton Waste Management Site free of charge and diverted from landfill:



Blue Box materials (free for residential loads only; commercial loads are subject to charge)



GreenCart organics (free for residential loads only)



Eye glasses
Electronics (cell phones, computers, monitors, TVs, stereos, DVD players, etc.) (up to five pieces per load)



Tires (up to five tires per load)



Wine and champagne bottle corks (natural corks only)

Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) Depot

Household hazardous waste can injure waste collectors and can damage the environment if disposed of improperly. Household hazardous waste must not be put in the garbage or poured down the drain.



There is a 20 litre maximum per visit. No commercial hazardous waste can be accepted.
