

Ontario party leader Mike Schreiner to address local federal Green meeting

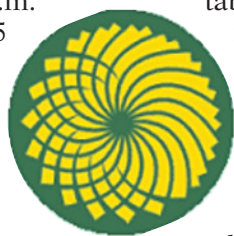
Ontario Green Party leader Mike Schreiner will be the guest speaker at the Wellington-Halton Hills Federal Green Party Association's Jan. 24 meeting in Rockwood.

The meeting is set for 7 p.m. at the Rockwood Library, 85 Christie St. (adjacent to the Rockmosa Community Centre).

Schreiner is a leading advocate for independent businesses, local food and sustainable communities and is well-known for his leadership in co-founding the award-winning Local Food Plus organization.

He started his career in the Guelph area as an entrepreneur and advocate

in the local food movement. As co-founder of WOW Foods, he worked for more than 10 years to connect local farmers with consumers in the GTA and Guelph area. He also helped establish Local Food Plus (LFP), a



non-profit which brings farmers and consumers together to promote financially, socially and environmentally sustainable local food systems.

He was elected leader of the Green Party of Ontario in 2009.

Brent Bouteiller, federal candidate for Wellington-Halton Hills Green Party, and the new local Green Party executive will also be on hand.

Acton man closer to claiming lottery prize

Sang Hoon Lee of Acton is one step closer to claiming his lottery win of \$25,000 from the Daily Keno draw on November 1.

As Lee is an employee at an OLG retail location, this prize falls within OLG's definition of an Insider Win.

So far this prize claim has completed the first step of a two-step Insider Wins process, which is an independent investigation of the claim by a third-party working in partnership with

OLG's regulator the Alcohol and Gaming Commission of Ontario (AGCO).

To complete the prize claim, the prize will be held for a 30-day waiting period as part of OLG's Insider Wins process, in order for OLG to publicize the win. If there are no additional claims on this prize, it will be paid to the claimant on February 4, based on this 30-day wait period.
