Sixteen-year-old forward Cory Highfield was taken first overall by the Mississauga Tomahawks in Sunday's draft of midget-aged players in the province. The 6-foot-1, 190-pound Grade 11 Georgetown District High School student notched a hat trick in Team Ontario's 9-5 win over B.C. in the gold medal game of last summer's Canadian Lacrosse Association midget boys' championships in Whitby. He was also named to the tournament all-star team at the Ontario Summer Games as a member of the Halton Hills Bulldogs' midgets. Another Georgetown resident, Connor Brown, was chosen fourth overall by Mississauga in last year's OLA Jr. A Draft. 
