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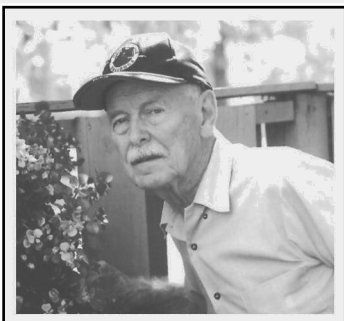

Pre-deceased by parents and siblings, his caring, giving, loving ways will be missed by Eve, his children David (Beverley), Lorraine, Barbara (Blake) and Rodger (Linda), his grandchildren Kevin (Stephanie), Brian (Veronique), David (Tracy), Michael (Alex), Christian, Daniel and Alexandra, and many other friends and acquaintances. Having an active life from a very early age, he was always involved in serving various aspects of business, community, country and his family.
