Also starting April 1 the Blue Box program will be expanded to include: clear plastic

clamshell containers; black and clear plastic take-out containers; plastic plant pots and trays; plastic plates, cups, and coffee lids (no cutlery); single-serve plastic food containers (no film or foil); empty metal paint cans (lids removed) and cardboard cans (frozen juice, dough, chips).

apply to rural Halton Hills residents as they don't receive garbage collection from the Region. Garbage Tags will not be accepted at Leferink Transfer Station.

Townhouse complexes with common garbage piles and apartment buildings with curbside garbage collection will be permitted three bags per unit and no garbage tags.

The current bage limits will remain in place for churches and commercial daycares and there will be no Garbage Tags required. The Region plans to work with them to limit the amount of garbage they put out.

The first garbage collection after Christmas will not require Garbage Tags, but a six-bag maximum applies. Complimentary Diaper Bag Tags or Healthcare Tags will be provided to approved residents, with a six-bag maximum.

"We should really be proud of all the achievement the residents of Halton and Halton Hills have done," said


But he added, "there's still a lot of good material that can be diverted from the garbage." The average garbage bag contains 13 per cent blue box material and 29 per cent Green-Cart items, he explained.

Rivers said currently about 85 per cent of residents place three or less bags of garbage out for collection every other week, 95 per cent use their Blue Boxes, and 70 per cent utilize the GreenCart.

Residents will learn more about the changes to the program from mailers sent to homes later this month, and another one next month. There will
