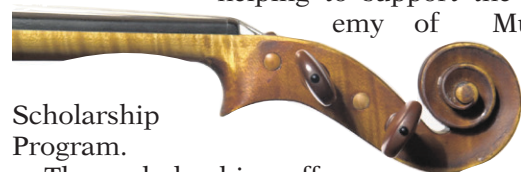


Youth String Orchestra to start up in Georgetown

Children, ages 8 through 16, can now participate in a local orchestra organized just for them. The new Georgetown Orchestra is for kids that have been playing the violin, viola, or string bass for over a year and would like learn and perform classical string music with other kids.

Unlike most youth orchestra programs children do not have to audition but should be able to read music at the beginner level. All the music will have parts written for beginner through to advanced students. There will be at least two major concerts per year with the proceeds helping to support the Academy of Music



Scholarship Program.

The scholarship offers music lessons at no charge to children in the community that otherwise would not be able to arrange lessons themselves. Children are referred to the school from Big Brothers Big Sisters of Halton.

The first rehearsal will be on Wednesday January 22, at 6 p.m. at the Academy of Music, 330 Guelph St., Unit 9 (two buildings east of Tim Horton's)

Georgetown welcomes Atlas Copco Rentals as they lease a property on Highway 7, north of 22 Sideroad. Atlas Copco is a multinational company with rental outlets in 50 countries. From their new location in Georgetown they will rent portable air compressors to their clients in Ontario and Manitoba.

Atlas Copco is the world leader in 100% oil-free air compressors. They maintain top ratings for ISO certification in their industry for Quality, Environmental and Occupational Health and Safety Management.

Their compressors generally have a capacity of about 1,000 cfm to 2,500 cfm. Some are electrically operated, but most are diesel powered. They are rented out to clients for periods as short as one day; but most are rented for six to seven months at a time, with



a few on contract for several years.

Their units are used by drilling contractors for well drilling and geothermal drilling, for tunneling, cleaning out utility pipes and irrigation pipes after installation, and pressure testing of various new installations. In Manitoba they are used to power wind tunnels for jet engine testing and in north-

ern Ontario for mining exploration.

The property they leased belongs to Murt Allison who has owned since the 1950s when he operated a Texaco Service Station from the site.

The real estate agent was Peter Scholz, industrial broker with Royal LePage Meadowtowne Realty, Brokerage in Georgetown.

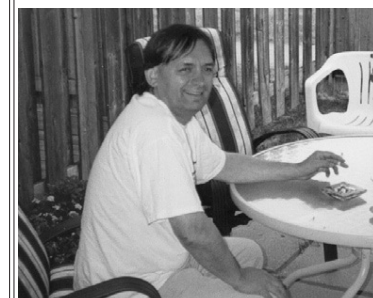
