# Region has a new emergency notification service

A new emergency notification service launched in Halton recently will help officials to better notify households and businesses in the event of an emergency situation.

The Region now has access to a more complete database that includes contact information for more than 95 per cent of Halton residents and businesses with traditional landline telephone service.

In the case of an incident, such as a flood or chemical spill, the Community Emergency Notification Service (CENS) will telephone the affected homes.

Regional Chair Gary Carr said Halton is one of the first Canadian municipalities to have access to the data to use in an emergency situa-

"At Halton Region, we take our

emergency management responsibilities very seriously and are committed to working with our partners to ensure we are ready to respond to any emergency situation and able to reach as many people as possible," Carr said in a media release.
