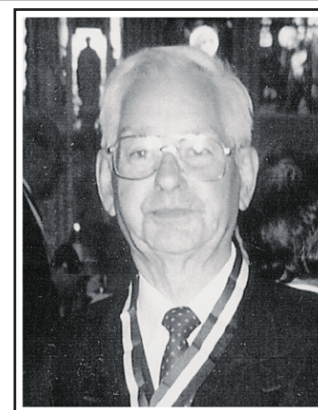

He was an early founder of the Bruce Trail, spending many weekends cutting through bush making paths for future use for many. Grant was always an active member at St. George's Anglican Church having served as the Church Warden and People's Warden and thus being honoured by receiving the Order of Niagara. Grant also volunteered for many years with the Canadian Cancer Society (later Cashh) both driving and serving as a canvassing convener. Grant put his accounting degree to use by volunteering continuously over the years to various charities and non profit organizations in Georgetown. Friends were received at the J.S.
