## **Hornby well** issue soaks region budget

Nearly seven years after well problems started arising in Hornby when the water table was impacted while Halton Region was building a pumping station, four wells are still having issues.

Halton Regional Council recently approved spending an additional \$250,000 to fix the wells bringing the total cost to resolve all 68 private well problems in that area, to about \$3.2 million.

At a recent Planning and Public Works Committee meeting Halton Hills Wards 1 & 2 Regional Councillor Clark Somerville said, "This has been the biggest nightmare I've ever seen."

"It's a nightmare on Hornby Rd.," he said.

Both Somerville and Halton Hills Mayor Rick Bonnette say extending municipal water services to affected properties on Hornby Rd. should be considered.
