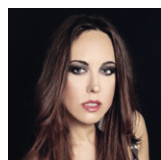

Gladkova's inspiration comes from the brilliant colours of spring blossoms. Her crisp, deliberate brushwork captures the play of light and the beauty of nature.

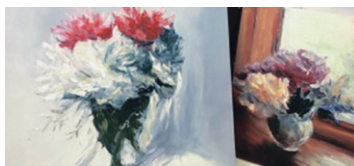
Gladkova says, "I love to inspire other people to open their minds and express themselves through art." Come to
