Norval Presbyterian Church is now elevator accessible

Norval Presbyterian Church recently held a dedication ceremony at its Sunday service for a new elevator, which will make the heritage building— with a lot of stairs— accessible to everyone of all ages and abilities.

The elevator, which cost about \$150,000, will hold two people plus one wheelchair (or stroller), and extends from the bottom hall to the sanctuary upstairs. An accessible door from the parking lot accesses the elevator between the two floors. Funding was

raised over the past six years through anonymous donations, in memoriam donations, and church fundraisers like the popular corn roast.

The new addition will give the Norval church the ability to hold more community events in its large basement hall.
