

# Acton man is invested into the Order of Canada

An Acton man was among 45 Canadians invested into the Order of Canada in Ottawa yesterday (Wednesday).

David Johnston, Governor General of Canada, bestowed the honour on 35 Members and 10 Officers at Rideau Hall.

Murray McEwen of Acton was invested as a Member.

McEwen is considered one of the trailblazers of the sweetener industry. He has shown vision and leadership within the business sector and in his community.

McEwen headed several premier refineries, including Redpath Sugars, and played a major role



in developing the sugar and sweetener business in North America.

Beyond his three decades in the food industry, McEwen has been an active contributor to many community organizations, including Breakfast for Learning, a national charity that provides children with the nutrition they need to grow and learn.

The Order of Canada was created in 1967, during Canada's centennial year to recognize outstanding achievement, dedication to the community and service to the nation. Since its creation more than 6,000 people from all sectors of society have been invested into the Order.

- Come together to help clean up! The Town asks residents who have the capabilities to think of neighbours who could use assistance in removing and transporting debris. The Town of Caledon's Public Works will continue to work with the community to manage remaining debris.
