1. How would you fund and improve transportation in Halton Hills?

The Ontario NDP will deliver two-way, all-day GO train service to Acton and Georgetown. A NDP government will allocate funds from our \$29 billion 10 year transit fund - and we will begin flowing funds immediately for two-way, all-day GO service to Acton, Georgetown, Guelph and Kitchener-Waterloo.

This includes allocating 7.5 cents per litre of the existing gas tax to public transit and transportation along with the other dedicated revenue measures described in the proposed Budget 2014. We will also introduce a modest increase in the general corporate income tax rate.

1. What is the most important issue facing Halton Hills?
