For 2015, we have expanded our Calendar to feature the new Halton Region Guide which includes useful information about Regional services, how to prepare your family for an emergency, key contact numbers and sources for getting the latest information about Halton. The addition of the Guide provides residents with essential information in one resource.

The Waste Calendar provides a full waste collection schedule for February 2015 to March 2016 which includes holiday collection delays and an overview of the town's five collection areas.

It also features Blue Box, GreenCart, bulk waste, yard waste and metal and appliances collection for residents of Acton and Georgetown.

The Calendar also contains valuable information on sorting waste, different types of waste, waste diversion and the Halton Waste Management Site, one of the Region's most valuable assets.

With the cost of constructing a new landfill nearing \$1 billion, Halton residents have significantly extended the Waste Site's lifespan with an impressive waste diversion rate of 62 per cent for single-family

households.

I am confident that the information included in the 2015 Calendar will support our combined efforts to Reduce, Reuse and Recycle in Hal-
